

LABYRINTH PRESENTATION and WALK in YACHATS

Kay Kinneavy, Oregon Representative of The Labyrinth Society, is offering an experience of walking and a presentation showing the variety of labyrinths in Oregon, Saturday July 30, 6:30 p.m. In the Yachats COMMONS big room.

The portable labyrinth will be available for walking at 5:00 p.m. and following the Presentation.

Kinneavy, a labyrinth artist from Neskowin, says “Many cultures have used labyrinths in various designs; their common feature is one curving path to a center, and the same path leading out again, without false byways.”

Marie Green, Chair of Yachats Labyrinth Park Project Task Force, says “after extensive research and thoughtful and lively discussions, the Task Force has found strong interest in creating a labyrinth in Yachats for Yachatians and visiting tourists.”

Kinneavy's Presentation will show the variety of labyrinths in Oregon and some of the many ways labyrinths are being used as a tool for education, community building, promoting peace and justice and private meditation.
